**2006 Homeowner and Renter Rebate**

2006 Homeowner and Renter Assistance Rebate Claims may be filed for past years if you were unable to file the claim on time because you were medically incapacitated. If you were medically incapacitated, you may file a claim within six months of your recovery, or within three years of the fiscal year that you are filing for, whichever is sooner. You must submit proof of medically certified incapacity with your claim, **and use the claim form for the specific year**. Do not use the 2006 claim form for past years. There are no other exceptions that would allow you to claim for past year.

*The 2007 Homeowner and Renter Assistance Rebate Program will begin in July 2007. Mastick will have volunteers available to assist you with your claim forms.*
